#### What's on the test?

**ACT:** English, Math, Reading, Science and an optional Writing Test **SAT:** Evidence-based Reading and Writing, Math, and an optional essay



#### Do wrong answers cost points?

#### How is it scored?

**ACT:** Composite score of 1–36 (1–36 in each test) **SAT:** Total score of 400–1600 (200–800 in each section)



#### Which test is better?

#### How long is it?

**ACT:** 2 hours, 55 minutes (without Writing Test) 3 hours, 35 minutes (with Writing Test)
