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MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT TEST-OPTIONAL ADMISSIONS?

Test Blind
admissions processes
do not require SAT or
ACT scores for
admissions
consideration.

Test-optional schools receive more applications and have lower admission rates.


If any school or scholarship you apply to requires SAT or ACT scores, your process is not test-optional.

STANDARDIZED TESTS IN ADMISSIONS

Most schools still accept both the SAT and ACT


➤ Many scholarships are still directly tied to SAT/ACT Scores — 200+


> Selective schools view the SAT and ACT as "predictive of performance"

Academic Preparation

You must complete 15 <u>A-G courses</u> with at least 11 courses finished prior to the beginning of your last year of high school. To be competitive in the UCLA admission process, applicants should present an academic profile much stronger than any minimum UC admission requirements. See below for a listing of the A-G requirements:

- 2 years history/social science
- 4 years of college-preparatory English
- 3 years of mathematics (4 years recommended)
- 2 years of laboratory science (3 years recommended)
- 2 years of language other than English (3 years recommended)
- 1 year of visual and performing arts (if available)
- 1 year of college-preparatory elective


